GRADUATING CLASS 2021

Thank you so much for your prayers and financial assistance. With the help of God, we were able to successfully conclude our 2020/21 academic sessions. Though we had challenges in the first semester because of the Covid-19 lock down, the second semester, which ran from January — May, went well. However, we could not hold the graduation ceremony as it is our tradition. We are hoping to combine the graduation ceremonies of 2019/20, 2020/21, and 2021/22. We will be having a graduation ceremony for the three sets in May, 2022, Lord's willing. We have not done this before, but the situation has forced us to adopt this change. We hope it does not happen again.

However, for this year, we had 28 students who completed their courses of study for the award of BA degree, 2 students for Diploma in Ministry, and 3 students for certificate in ministry. Out of the 28 students graduating in the BA program, 3 were foreign nationals (1 from Zimbabwe, 1 from Chad and 1 from Sierra Leone). Two of them have returned to their countries and one will return this June, Lord's willing. Out of the 33 students graduating, we have 7 women. This is the first in the history of the school that we have so many ladies in a particular graduating set. Thank you for your continued support and prayers.

Our rabbit farm started with two home-made cages in a facility we believed could accommodate between 30-40 rabbits, but we could only afford to start with 13 rabbits. Well, as we expected, the population of our rabbits grew very fast. We found we could have all metal cages manufactured that saved space and helped us keep every cage cleaner. A bank of 10 hutches (cages) cost \$80 each to manufacture. Can you help us teach our student this very productive business? The days became full, the weeks flew by with classes, activities, and projects. I served as a lecturer in 3rd year General Epistles and Homiletics, and 1st year Pauline Epistles. Helping the students in sermon development and delivery made me wonder sometime who was teaching who!

Evangelism and social activities were hampered by Covid restrictions that were beginning to taper off as we prepared to return to Savannah, TN, at the close of the semester in early May. The work of the school, however, continues unabated, training young men and women in sound doctrine, that they may spread the

Gospel in Nigeria and their home lands. One of the highlights to share was the opportunity to introduce the French speaking students from neighboring Niger, Chad, and Cameroon to the Back to the Bible Personal Evangelism program, produced by Rob Whitacre and the House to House, Heart to Heart team, under the oversight of the elder of the Jacksonville church of Christ in Jacksonville, Alabama. The HTH team provided the evangelism series in French, along with other resources that these men could take back to their villages to use in saving souls. They were so grateful to have these tools and we look forward to hearing of the fruit in its season.


MA PROGRAMS
